CVTC Computer Class in March - Bert Spangler, W9ZZI

A new basic computer course is being offered at the CVTC starting on March 15, and I'm wondering if you might put something about it on the web site or in the newsletter in hopes of getting a few more people to sign up for it. They are accepting registrations at this time but they still need five more people to sign up for it in order to actually hold it.

Many of the hams are too advanced for this course, but there may be some who, like myself, would benefit a lot from it. I corresponded with the instructor, Mark Puig, and this is how he described the class to me in an e-mail early last month:

"Later in the year (mid-March) we are looking at running a continuing ed class on computer basics and Internet security. This will be an evening course and will probably run for 8 weeks starting in March. In this course I will cover PC hardware basics, installation of Windows operating systems, some basic home/small business networking, Adware/Spyware and Virus protection." ANTENNAS

One of the most asked questions when it comes to antennas is what kind of wire should I use. The answer is as varied as the people who put them up. Things to consider are: Stranded or Solid, Coated or Bare, Thickness, Simple rules to follow: Copper vs Everything Else.

Once you pick the wire you want make sure you have thought these points out:

1. If a wire is going to be left on the ground coated /insulated wire is a must.
2. If a wire is on snow you can use either as snow in an insulator.
3. If a wire is up in the air and away from anything conductive you can use either type.
4. If up in the air and near or touching anything conductive you must use coated/insulated wire.
5. If you live in areas that are subject to bad weather especially high winds or ice storms heavier gauge wire should be used so it can with stand the elements.

OK now go out and put up something. Experimenting is half the fun in this hobby.

TECHNICAL TIDBITS

Soldering requires clean, **Really Clean parts:** Firstly, and without exception, all parts -- including the iron tip itself -- must be clean and free from contamination. Solder just will not "take" to dirty parts! Old components or copper board can be notoriously difficult to solder, because of the layer of oxidation which builds up on the surface of the leads. This repels the molten solder and this will soon be evident because the solder will "bead" into globules, going everywhere except where you need it. Dirt is the enemy of a good quality soldered joint!
